Visit Wildcat Ridge Hawk Watch to:

- Get an unobstructed view of migrating hawks.
- Discover when and how to look for migrating hawks.
- Learn to identify hawks with experienced hawk watchers.
- Make new friends interested in the outdoors and hawks.
- Become part of an exciting outdoor Citizen Science project.

Wildcat Ridge Accessibility:

- Open ledge with 180° view of NYC skyline and Watchung Ridges.
- One mile moderate hike from gravel parking lot. Take gravel road on left, past yellow gate.
- No fees or restroom facilities; bring all food and beverages.
- Food available at several local delis on C-513 before reaching park.

Quick Info:

- Volunteer-led counts; Spring Feb 15 – May 15; Fall Aug 15 – Nov 15.
- Exit 37 off I-80. Turn onto C-513 North (Green Pond Rd.), 6.3 ml to Upper Hibernia Road (on right). 2.7 miles to gravel parking lot.

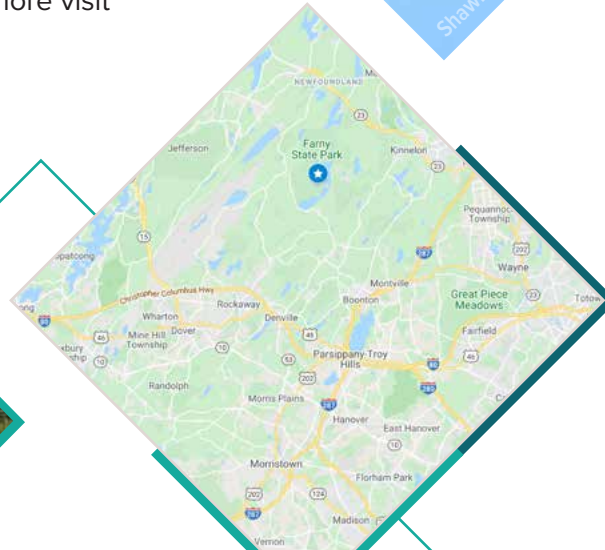

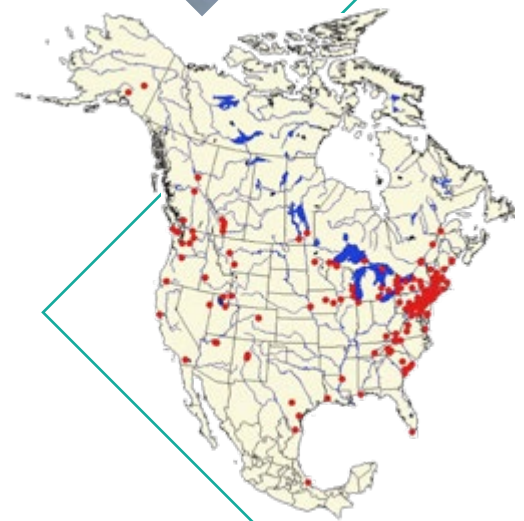
